Our staff assists students with academic subjects, study skills and organizational skills that promote successful transition and completion of public school education in grades K-12. Native American School Counselor

The Seneca Nation Education Department is pleased to announce the addition of a Native American School Counselor as a component of the student services it provides. This position will serve as an advocate and collaborate with the Tri-District Native American support staff representatives and the counseling department staff members from the Silver Creek Central School District, Lake Shore Central School District and the Gowanda Central School District. The focus will be to assist in the academic, career and personal/social needs of our students. New initiatives will focus on career readiness and youth empowerment strategies for the 4th and 5th grade students. This position will be able to provide presentation utilizing prevention and intervention strategies. In developing responsive services it is noted that student school attendance is a priority as well as the holistic well-being of our students and our community at large. Collaboration with the schools, parents/guardians, and the community members is the key when it comes to the future of our Native youth.

Seneca Nation AmeriCorps Program

AmeriCorps is a national service program designed to recruit and utilize volunteers to assist in the Cattaraugus Education Department mission. AmeriCorps members are not "employees", they are national service volunteers who receive a livable allowance, an education award upon completing their contractual obligation to the Seneca Nation AmeriCorps program. The member's core mission is to focus on three priorities:

- 1. Provide academic assistance to students struggling in ELA & Math proficiencies in various sites located in Gowanda, Lake Shore and Silver Creek districts and the Saylor building.
- 2. Assist in raising awareness in the Seneca community regarding emergency preparation for future natural disasters.
- 3. Supplement Seneca Nation efforts to encourage and expand students' appreciation of their language, culture and history.

Seneca Nation AmeriCorps Program new initiative will train and utilize a corps of capable, committed individuals to work with students K-8 challenged by ELA & Math proficiency. Its members will be providing academic coaching to students in 1:1 or small groups to facilitate students' improvement.

The program is currently under construction and is currently recruiting members (generally 18+) to work as Academic Coaches. The startup date is set for November 1st. Community Education & Culture Program

The Seneca Nation of Indians Department of Education's Community Education and Culture Program offers inschool, after-school and adult learning services both on territory and within the tri-district schools. Students have the opportunity to participate in language and culture programming and courses. We provide Seneca Language instruction at the Lake Shore middle school and high school in order for students to meet their foreign language requirements for graduation. We also provide educational classes in general interest areas for the community.

The **After School Culture Program** is for 5th-8th graders and will begin in September. This program will be four oneweek sessions (once per quarter) at each district throughout the school year. During this program, students will have the opportunity to learn about many different traditional cultural arts.

Community education and cultural classes will also resume this fall. These will be evening classes open to the community to participate. Please watch for notices and flyers to be posted throughout the year.

Native American Studies Program

The Seneca Nation Department of Education – Cattaraugus Territory, will again offer the Native American Studies Program for the 2015-2016 school year. The program hosts a Native Studies instructor who works within the tridistricts in order to provide Native based elective and variance courses in order to ensure our students can continue to reinforce their culture while still receiving credit toward graduation.

The **Iroquois Studies** course seeks to teach students the skills necessary for them to not only appreciate and understand the cultural history of the Haudenosaunee, but to examine the many ways they have impacted North America. From the creation of a League of Five Nations, improvement of crop varieties, involvement in conflicts, and development of political activism the Haudenosaunee helped shape America into the nation it is today. In Gowanda, Silver Creek and Lake Shore Central schools the course is offered as a variance for senior students who are exempt from Government and Economics by taking the course.

The **Native American Culture Thru Film** course seeks to teach students the skills necessary for them to not only appreciate and understand the cultural history of all indigenous peoples, but to examine how film has evolved to include their culture. The course utilizes contemporary historical and cultural films in order to reinforce Native and European interactions, but also to allow students to explore effects of these interactions on the parties involved.

If students are interested in any of these courses, parents can express that interest on the last page of the packet. (Native American Studies Courses) The Native American Studies teacher will be in contact with the parents and guidance staff to ensure students get the opportunity to attend the courses.

Home Work Help

The Seneca Nation Department of Education – Cattaraugus Territory, will again offer Home Work Help for the 2015-2016 school year. The Home Work Help service will be offered both within the school buildings and on the territory. The AASP/JOM teachers offer additional time after school hours to students in order to re-teach core concepts, assist in homework completion, and many of our staff run after school programs that support student enrichment with their academics. The service will also be offered on the territory from 3:45 until 5:15pm Monday thru Thursday. The target grade levels for Homework Help will be $3^{rd} - 12^{th}$ grade. Start date is 9/22/15. This service requires sign up by parents. You can do so utilizing the Enrollment form on the last page of this packet.

Sylvan Learning in Williamsville, NY

The Seneca Nation Department of Education – Cattaraugus Territory, will again offer Sylvan Learning tutoring for the 2015-2016 school year. The Sylvan Learning offers students the opportunity to get one-on-one tutoring. The program is located in Williamsville, NY and transportation is not provided. There are a limited number of spots available. If interested, please indicate that on the Enrollment Form (last page of packet) and we will contact you.

The department is currently reviewing last year's services on the Cattaraugus Territory. After review has been completed, the program could be funded again for the 2015-2016 school year beginning in November or December. Look for more information in the future and keep in touch with the department.

Instrument Rental

The Seneca Nation Department of Education – Cattaraugus Territory, will again offer Instrument Rental. This service is to assist with the rental fees associated with student participation in school sponsored musical programs or band. The funds are distributed on a first come first served basis until funds are expended. If interested, please pick up the application with information on requirements at the Cattaraugus Education Department.

R.E.A.C.H. and Student of the Quarter Incentives

R.E.A.C.H. is an acronym that stands for Responsibility, Excellence, Achievement, Community, and Honor. The program contains three components targeting achievements, attendance and citizenship and is designed to provide tangible incentives for students willing to put forth the effort to reach their full potential.

Any Native American student eligible for Title VII services, attends one of the tri-district schools, or receives services from the Department of Education-Cattaraugus Territory may participate in the R.E.A.C.H. Program. Students do NOT have to attend AASP/JOM in order to participate.

The **Student of the Quarter** selection is designed to reward students for exhibiting consistent effort, good attendance, strong academics, good citizenship, school spirit, and community service. The AASP/JOM teachers select up to one student per grade level per building. Those selected students get an incentive and recognition in the AASP/JOM Newsletter.

Varsity Scholar Athlete Award, Senior Incentive Award and Native Success Scholarships

Each year the Education Department offers several scholarships and incentives at the high school level in order to celebrate the success of our students. The Varsity Scholar Athlete Awards is a reward for students that exemplify balancing school work with sports. The Senior Incentive and Native Success Scholarship reward graduating seniors that demonstrate their desire to pursue higher education and commitment to their community. Each incentive has an application with requirements that students must meet in order to be eligible to apply for the award.
