## **NCWWI Meets with Child & Family Services**

Child and Family Services Cattaraugus Supervisor- Irene Wheeler, has been part of a group initiative in collaboration with; Office of Child and Family Services Native American Bureau, National Child Welfare Workforce Institute (NCWWI), Erie County Department of Social Services, and the University of Buffalo. Since May 2022 the work being done has been to support policies relating to the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) and address racial equity in the child welfare practice, as well as, strategizing to incorporate ICWA into the School of Social Work curriculum at UB.

On July 17th Child and Family Services hosted an onsite meeting on the Cattaraugus territory. The intent was to look at how to improve the partnership between the Seneca Nation and the Erie County Department of Social Services, with the commitment of getting to know the Seneca Nation to fully understand what is working well in the relationship. With hopes to improve and ensure the county is implementing and excelling all the best practices according to ICWA requirements. After a luncheon catered by Chiavetta's and a group discussion, Irene led the group on a walking tour of the Seneca Nation complex and discussed the historical landmarks of the Thomas Indian Residential Boarding School and the lasting impacts that generational trauma has on our Seneca communities.

The group ended with a sage cleansing, done by Jimmy White from Seneca Strong, and a group photo in front of the Community Health & Wellness Building.

# **Progress on the Cattaraugus Indian Reservation Health Center New Build**

Mark Cerrone (sitework)

- Continued to backfill foundation footers and walls
- Continued to install fabric and crusher run subbase within the building footprint

Huber Construction (concrete foundations)

- Building's concrete foundation is 100% complete
- Contractor has demobilized until the slab-on-deck is ready to proceed

Apollo Steel (structural steel)

- 9 truckloads of structural steel elements have been delivered on site (approx. 60% of the entire structure)
- 2 truckloads of decking material have been delivered on site (100% of the entire material needed)
- Started to set columns and beams for the first two bays of the building

Structure will be erected to accommodate interior work during winter. Currently on schedule for fall 2024 completion.
