- Use their knowledge to act as advocates for emergency preparedness in their homes and communities.
- Discuss the role that science plays in emergency preparedness.

ATV eCourse

This course is the best place for adults and teens to start on their path to understanding all-terrain vehicles and safe riding strategies. The course includes videos, pictures, and interactive games to make it a fun and effective learning experience. During the course, users take progress quizzes and receive a certificate upon successful completion. The entire course takes approximately 2.5 hours to complete. You can stop at any point and your progress will be saved so that you can return and pick up where you left off.

CITIZEN PREPAREDNESS TRAINING

Citizen Preparedness Corps
 A free program delivered state-wide by the American Red Cross. The program seeks to improve community resiliency on an individual and household level by teaching citizens valuable life skills on how to prepare for, respond to, and recover from any natural or man-made disaster.

Overall Goal
 To increase community resiliency. By teaching individuals how to take care of themselves and their household during a disaster, it allows them to expand their support to a neighborhood and community level.

Target Audience
 All individuals ranging from high school ages to senior citizens. The life skills that are learned through this presentation are valuable for anyone and everyone.

Presentation Outline
 The PowerPoint presentation is about 1 – 1½ hours. Primarily, to increase awareness, it covers the different kinds of natural and man-made disasters. It provides all aspects of preparedness for small to large-scale disasters, including where to get more information and how to prepare a household emergency preparedness kit. The second half of the presentation provides guidance for responding and recovering from a disaster whether it causes structural, physical, or mental damage.
