Gowanda High School Updates

The 2024-2025 school year has been flying by here at Gowanda High School. With the last few months being completely packed with students getting back into an academic routine, participating in extracurricular activities, finishing up the fall sports season, attending cultural activities, and exploring colleges and other future avenues, these students are proving everyday how incredibly diverse they all are and how much pride they are capable of bringing to their community!

Gowanda's homecoming spirit week, September 30-October 4, started with a school-wide "Orange Shirt Day" where all students were provided with an "Every Child Matters" shirt. The next couple of days included different themes pertaining to the Student Council sponsored "Galactic Gala" on October 5th in the high school gym. Many students participated in the themed week, eventually leading up to the Homecoming Football game at Hillis Field.

The 2024 Youth Summit held at the ECLC on Wednesday October 9th proved to be quite a success. Gowanda had 15 students attend, along with students and staff from Silver Creek and Lake Shore. Students participated in different programs and presentations throughout the day which included cooking traditional foods, a Longhouse canvas painting, and beading activities. The Summit ended with a lunch of Indian tacos using the fry bread made by the attendees. The entire experience was filled with learning opportunities, culture, and fun.

Native American Heritage month at Gowanda has provided several opportunities highlighting cultural importance in and out of the classroom. The Title VI staff invited high school students to participate in a traditional dance assembly in the auditorium Friday November 15. High school students and staff were invited in the morning, followed by a lunch of traditional food prepared by local chef, Lorinda John. It was an educational and enlightening experience for all involved. November 15th also marked "Rock your Mocs" day, where students and staff were encouraged to wear moccasins to show unity and solidarity through traditional and beautiful Native American accessories.

Academics and continued education are also high priority among students at GHS. Native Outreach days at Syracuse University and Penn State were offered to eligible students. The Gowanda counseling department held their annual "Snacks and Apps" day where juniors and seniors are invited to the high school library to complete college applications, learn more about financial assistance and scholarships, and even talk with college and military representatives.

Gowanda's Native American athletes have been busy this fall! Several students completed successful sports seasons. Boys XC: Marcus Gamble (11), Cashis Montour (11), and Maddox Hudson (10). The boys cross country team competed at Sectional Championships November 1st at Knox Field in East Aurora and received Red Patches for their 2nd place finish. Cashis Montour (11) extended his season by qualifying for the States Championships in Queensbury, NY where he placed 38th out of 120 runners in the Class D race. Girls XC: Marissa Beaver (12), Degaswined (Gus) John (9), Karice John (12), Rhianna Woods (12), and Emma Golden (MGR, 11). Varsity Cheer: Addison Crooks (10), and Kierra Moses (12). Modified Cheer: Lillian Spruce (9). Youth Cheer: Raelin Smith (9), and Lillian Spruce (9). The youth cheer team received several first-place awards, along with awards for best tumbling, choreography, and grand champions for competitions in Syracuse, Sweet Home, and Elma. Varsity Football: Winter Rivera (12), Maddox Hudson (10), Dalen Stevens (10), Jayden John (11), Jeremy Henhawk (11), Jaxstin Johns (11). The football team earned a home playoff game this season, beating Wilson 31-20. Modified Football: Jaden Knopf (9), Donald Stevens (9), Mychael Williams (9), Emmett Williams (9), and Gavin Crooks (9). Varsity Soccer: Kyra-Mae Hurley (10), and Tayleigh Williams (10). Girls Swim: KaeVii Yasurek (12). KaeVii qualified for Class C championships this season. Varsity Volleyball: Cadence Luther (10), Maleina Moses (10), Corrina John (11), and Elizabeth Green (12). JV Volleyball: Cora Luther (9). The JV team successfully ended the regular season undefeated under new head coach, Brandi John. Travel: Senior Elizabeth Green plays for Competitive Edge Volleyball Club out of Lancaster where she has been competing alongside her regular season schedule at Gowanda. The annual BASIL basketball tournament hosted an array of teams including athletes Corrina John (11) and Trelin Warrior (10). A handful of lacrosse athletes participated in the annual LAXNAI tournament October 17-20 in Utica, NY. Ha'tsihgahdo:d Stevens (12), Ethan Steeprock (12), Randall John (10), and Hodaweo:je' John (11), all played for the Jr. Woodsmen team in the 18U category. These boys along with Dalen Stevens (10), Donald Stevens (9), and Jessup Stevens (12) are also participating in the CRILL (Cattaraugus Recreational Indoor Lacrosse League) season, playing for various teams. A couple seniors also did some solo traveling to play. Ethan Steeprock (12) and Felicia Scanlan (10) traveled to Maryland to compete in the Brogden Cup Tournament with the Haudenosaunee Nationals teams October 25-27. Ethan Steeprock also recently visited Onondaga Community College (OCC) with intentions to continue his lacrosse journey after high school. Seneka Jackson (12) competed in the Battle of the Border tournament with Pacific Northwest Lacrosse October 26-27 in Washington State. In other lacrosse news, senior Winter Rivera officially signed his financial aid agreement for The Ohio State University on National Signing Day, Wednesday November 13. Lake Shore Middle School Updates

Hello all! We're off to a great start here at the Middle School at Lake Shore.

This year, we have 84 students who attend William G. Houston Middle School this year. We have 28 sixth graders, 21 seventh graders, and 35 eighth graders. We're doing well academically, with Honor Roll and Merit Roll students for this first quarter.

Several of our students– 20 this year– played or participated in a fall season sport. Some of our students went to Cross Country regionals and sectionals. The Fall sports season seemed to pass us by so quickly! We wore green and white for school spirit and had a pep rally where student athletes were recognized. Then the athletes played fun games with their fellow students and teachers.

I participated with other Lake Shore district faculty in a training for a new way to assist my students. Restorative Practices, which is a process of using talking circles to work through conflicts and issues students face, was introduced to us in a series of three workshops. We meet once more, later in November, to discuss how we move forward with our new knowledge. My Title VI colleague and I conducted a talking circle with our seventh-graders girls to practice what we learnt and it was well received.

We've been very lucky to be able to spend a lot of time in our class, Room 300. We eat lunch together during 6th/7th/8th grade lunch periods. Some of our eighth-grade students participated in an art project with a guest artist from our community, Sandra Warrior. We had a Halloween party with costumes and food and fun. The Cattaraugus Behavioral Health Unit comes to visit us during lunch periods on Thursdays this year. They discuss health and wellness topics with our classes. My Brother's Keeper has resumed sessions after school, also on Thursdays.

I'm looking into some health and wellness workshops for the students, possibly for late January and early March. I'd like to invite the Nutrition Specialist and Fitness Coordinator from the CIRHC Wellness Center to do a program on healthy food choices and injury prevention. Many of our students play at least one sport and this education would help them. I'm also looking into a lacrosse stick pocket string session, which will be held in early March.

We (JOM and Title VI staff) co-hosted a night of cultural entertainment at our second Indigenous Fun Night, which was scheduled to take place here at the Middle School on November 15. We planned 90 minutes of fun and cultural enjoyment, with experience stations, a fashion show (of cultural attire), and a social, same as last year. More details on the event will be shared in the Second Quarterly Report.

Academic achievement, good attendance and school participation are the focus and goals here at William G. Houston Middle School! I'm enjoying getting to know the new-to-me sixth graders and being reacquainted with my seventh and eighth graders.

Lake Shore High School Updates

Students, faculty, and staff throughout the Lake Shore school district wore orange on September 30th for Every Child Matters/Orange Shirt Day. The Seneca 4 class went with Mr. Jordan Cooke to AJ Schmitt, JT Waugh, and Highland Elementary to help commemorate the day with students. They placed pinwheels in the ground at each of the schools in the district in remembrance of the survivors of Indian boarding schools and in memory of all those children who did not survive. Orange Shirt Day began in 2013 as a way to recognize and honor Indigenous families and communities who have been affected by residential schools. It is a show of support and understanding of the history of the school system that impacts many families today.

On October 9th, the Seneca Nation Education Department hosted a Youth Summit that was attended by 14 students: Caias John, Payton Stevens, Neveah Jimerson, Koltin Huff, Asa White, Saniya Seneca, Ariza Leroy, Jayla Kennedy, Debbie Jimerson, Gianna Waterman, Sara Himelein, Kamryn Bonafede, Kaysen John, and Arilyn Nephew. During the event, students engaged in several activities, including a beading workshop led by Sam Jacobs, and a traditional cooking lesson where they learned to make fry bread, mush, and Indian cookies with language staff from Sully Huff, which they enjoyed for lunch. Additionally, they participated in a canvas painting session with Sandra Warrior.

On Friday, October 25th, Lake Shore students along with students from Silver Creek and Gowanda joined together to attend a special student visitation day at Penn State University. The day was designed to provide an immersive experience in the college community and to learn about the unique resources and support programs available on campus for Indigenous students. Our students enjoyed a beautiful fall day touring the campus to get a taste of student life, exploring everything from classrooms to dorms to dining facilities. They also attended Q & A sessions with current Indigenous students (including LS grad Layla Seneca), PSU staff and faculty members where they learned about the academic programs and opportunities available at PSU. Lake Shore students that attended were Alison Boushie, Nanni Cooper, Shilo Pierce, Stevie Seneca, Kyrie Buffalo, Kate Kennedy, Layla Jimerson, Jayla Kennedy, Kade Nephew, Asa Thompson, Tyla Thompson.

On November 8th several Lake Shore high school students joined students from Gowanda and Silver Creek to attend the Native American Student Outreach Day at the University of Buffalo. The program was presented by the recently created Department of Indigenous Studies. UB describes the new Department of Indigenous Studies as one that "builds on UB's longstanding legacy as a key location for Haudenosaunee and Indigenous studies.

During the event, students learned about the Indigenous student support services and cultural programming available, and they had the opportunity to meet with Indigenous students and faculty. Additionally, the students enjoyed a tour of the Amherst campus. Students that attended the event were Asa Thompson, Layla Jimerson, Saniya Seneca, Cordelia Haring, Asa White, Phoenix Catalano and Kaysen John.


