This program is a family support initiative designed to strengthen the well-being of young children and their families, which provides in-home services that promote positive parenting, enhance child development, and connect families to essential community resources. By offering culturally relevant, evidence-based support, the program helps parents navigate early childhood challenges, improve family stability, and create nurturing home environments. The Advisory Committee plays a crucial role in ensuring the program remains effective, responsive to community needs, and aligned with the values of the Seneca Nation and the Seneca Arts and Learning Center.

What does the Advisory Committee do?

The Committee will:

- ✓ Provide recommendations on program policies, procedures, and culturally relevant practices.
- ✓ Support outreach, family engagement, and service coordination efforts to ensure families receive comprehensive support.
- ✓ Review program data and outcomes to guide decision-making and continuous improvement.
- ✓ Advise on funding opportunities and strategies for long-term sustainability.
- ✓ Foster collaboration across Nation departments to enhance family services and maximize support for caregivers.
