




Gowanda Middle School Updates

We normally stay Monday-Thursday, from 2:10-3:05. It is the student's responsibility to sign up daily and let us know if they need a bus pass. 

Hello all! We're off to a great start here at the JT Waugh Elementary School at Lake Shore. This year, we have 123 students total who attend the JT Waugh Elementary School. We started our year with 121, but with a couple of transfers in and out of our building, we're up to 123. This year is different for me as the JOM teacher because I visit classrooms for the majority of my day. I love it! I'm able to collaborate more with the teachers, and I get a better sense of my students' individual needs. We honored Orange Shirt Day: Every Child Matters, which took place on September 30. We had visitors from the Seneca 5 class from the high school come visit us and teach us Seneca Language words. District-wide, we all wore orange shirts for unity, remembrance and honor. We had our annual elementary Youth Summit Day, which took place on October 8, 2025. We engaged in cultural enrichment and educational activities such as Seneca history; archery; social songs and dances; and an artsy screen-printing project. In November, we've celebrated Native American Heritage Month. One way was at our district-wide Makers Faire. I helped manage a booth, where a middle school student and I helped people make bookmarks using dried flowers. I also helped the Title VI Home School Coordinator with her art project, which was cornhusk flowers. Our fourth graders all created a flower for a large display for the Faire. We're also doing an after-school program during the week called Seneca Study Squad. Open to third through fifth-graders, each night is dedicated to a specific grade: Tuesdays are for third graders; Wednesdays, fourth graders; and Thursdays, fifth graders. We do homework help, along with skills practice, organization planning, and our fifth graders will learn about middle school expectations. I also serve a snack. Right now, third grade Tuesdays are open as I don't have anyone coming. If your third grader needs extra help, you can still sign up! It's not too late. Rogue Spruce – Kindergarten Rogue was chosen to be recognized for nicely writing her ABCs, good job!


Anna Despense – 1st Grade Anna is being recognized for working hard on her writing, keep up the great work!


