The **Robin Dance** belongs to the stomp dance group of dances. The men lead the front of the line & women follow in the rear. This dance is sang with 2 cowhorn rattles.

You dance to the lead singers melody with a side step while facing inward or outward positioning. When the rattles have a rapid shake, that's the cue to alternate position (either inward or outward.) While changing positions there are 3 little steps or hops to imitate the robin.
